***Note 1:** These two days **are not public holidays** they are days on which all Government Departments (other than those providing essential services) will be closed.

Note 2: **Margaret Thatcher Day** falls on 10 January each year but is not a Government or public holiday.

Note 3: **Falkland Day** falls on 14 August each year but is not now a Government or public holiday. Executive Council agreed to move the holiday from 14 August to provide for the re-introduction of the Peat cutting holiday on the first Monday in October each year with effect from 2002.

Note 4: When a Public Holiday falls either on Saturday or Sunday, the holiday is carried over to the Monday.

Note 5: Clocks reverted 3rd Sunday in April and advanced 1st Sunday in September each year.
